He consults in developing countries and serves as a Senior Advisor for Physical Impairment issues for a non-governmental organization, CBM International. Dr. Penny is a Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of British Columbia with active memberships at BIS, CNIS and the Order of Canada.

control in Sub - Saharan Africa and in 1997 the Injury Prevention Initiative for Africa-(IPIFA) a 10 country network. Dr. Lett is the Secretary General of IPIFA Scientific Associate of both the ICC Uganda & ICC Tanzania, and Adjunct Professor of Surgery at both McGill University & University of British Columbia. He has developed more than a dozen structured surgical skills courses and participated in the pilot of EOMC in Tanzania and Ethiopia.



ESSENTIAL OSTEOMYELITIS MANAGEMENT INSTRUCTORS COURSE

The Essential Osteomyelitis Management (EOM) Instructors Course presents the didactic material, including lectures, interactive teaching sessions and surgical simulation, to surgeons who wish to become certified teachers of this course. Participants in the instructors' course will learn how this structured program assures the learners of a consistent educational experience. The learners' course progresses from interactive quiz sessions and lectures, to case-based radiographic classification and surgical planning, to simulation of common osteomyelitis surgical procedures and joint aspiration procedures using low fidelity simulators.

COURSE PURPOSE

Junior surgical residents and Junior general practitioners will learn to diagnose and manage acute and chronic hematogenous osteomyelitis, pyomyositis and septic arthritis. In addition, learners will also be exposed to a radiographic classification of osteomyelitis, identification and handling of bone instruments, surgical approaches, joint aspiration techniques and planning for blood loss and other complications.

The instructors course guides the surgeon to learn and practice the interactive sessions and surgical simulations that each learner taking the course will be exposed to. A practical session in how to make the surgical simulators will be included. At the end of the workshop, the surgeon will have learned the training skills required to instruct junior surgical residents and general medical officers in essential osteomyelitis and septic arthritis care, emphasizing children, at the district hospital level.
