STRUCTURED HERNIA REPAIR INSTRUCTOR'S COURSE

The Structured Hernia Repair Instructor's Course presents the didactic material including lectures and interactive teaching sessions to surgeons who wish to become certified teachers of this course. Participants in the instructor's course will learn how this structured program assures the learners of a consistent educational experience.

The learner's course progresses from interactive lectures to surgical simulation, and then continues to clinical instruction with patients. The instructor's course also guides the surgeon to learn and practice the lectures, exercises and hands on simulations that each learner will use when taking this course. At the end of the workshop, the surgeon will have learned the training skills required to instruct general physicians to successfully perform uncommon procedures.

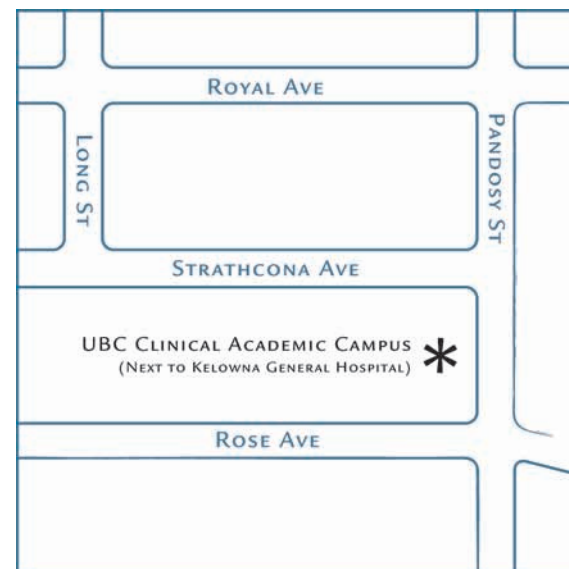
